School Council's Anti-Bullying Charter



Article 9

You have the right to be protected from being hurt and mistreated, in body or mind.

- We know we must make good choices about our own behaviour and to do the right things, even when it's hard. We work together to make the school a happy place.
- The school's values are important to us, so we will always be respectful, inclusive and caring towards our peers and adults. As a 'rights respecting school', we understand the need to listen to one another and respect and protect each other's rights. We will listen to each other fully and respect each other's need for personal space / time.
- We believe that there should be no bullying at Crown Wood Primary School.
- Every child at our school has the right to be safe and happy. They have the right to learn and play free from intimidation and fear, in school, in the community and on-line.
- We do not tolerate physical violence, name-calling, exclusion from a group, or other actions that could damage a child's self-esteem.
- We respect each other's belongings. Damaging, hiding or stealing another person's property is a form of bullying.
- We celebrate our differences and respect each other's strengths and weaknesses. When somebody makes a mistake or is not good at something we help them. We know that we learn by taking risks and from making mistakes.
- Every member of our school knows they must tell an adult if somebody is being bullied.
- The adults in school help us understand the different forms of bullying and how to keep ourselves and others safe. They support us to work, learn and play together. They deal with possible problems sensitively and may talk to our parents or carers.
- We review our anti-bullying charter every two years to try and make improvements. We welcome the help of governors, teachers, parents, other children and members of the local community. We consider our rights and the values of our school when reviewing our charter.
